Key dates:

1516: Leonardo da Vinci arrived at the Château du Clos Lucé

1516-1519: Leonardo da Vinci worked on many projects to meet the commands of the King of France

1519: death of Leonardo da Vinci in his room, at Clos Lucé

1954: opening to the public

2003: creation of the Leonardo da Vinci Park, the first open-air museum dedicated to the Italian master

2007: creation of the «Leonardo's Garden»

2016: end of the restoration campaigns – opening of Leonardo da Vinci's restored workshops

2016-2019: celebrations of the 500th anniversary of the Leonardo da Vinci years at the Château du Clos Lucé

2019: official celebrations of the 500th anniversary of the death of Leonardo da Vinci at the Château du Clos Lucé

Coming soon: opening of the 500m2 New Museum Space «Leonardo da Vinci Painter and Architect»
